



Intelligent Energy Europe



The objective of the Intelligent Energy – Europe II (IEE II) Programme is to contribute to secure, sustainable and competitively priced energy for Europe, by providing for action:

- to foster energy efficiency and the rational use of energy resources;
- to promote new and renewable energy sources and to support energy diversification;
- to promote energy efficiency and the use of new and renewable energy sources in transport.

The IEE Programme has become the main Community instrument to tackle non-technological barriers to the spread of efficient use of energy and greater use of new and renewable energy sources.

IEE covers action in the following fields:

1. Energy efficiency and rational use of resources (SAVE), including:

- energy-efficient buildings¹
- energy efficient products
- Proposals related to industrial excellence in energy: not foreseen in the 2009 Call.

2. New and renewable energy resources (ALTENER), including:

- electricity from renewable energy sources (RES-e)
- renewable energy heating/cooling (RES-H/C);
- small-scale renewable energy applications in buildings;
- Biofuels;
- small-scale decentralised renewable energy systems: not foreseen in the 2009 Call.

3. Energy in transport (STEER) to promote energy efficiency and the use of new and renewable energies sources in transport, including

- alternative fuels and clean and energy-efficient vehicles;
- energy-efficient transport;
- capacity-building in transport for existing local and regional agencies.

- 4. Integrated initiatives** combining several of the above fields or relating to certain Community priorities:
- European networking for local action²;
 - sustainable energy communities;
 - bio-business;
 - energy services;
 - intelligent energy education (of teachers only)
 - creation of local and regional energy agencies and combined heat and power (CHP): not foreseen in this Call 2009.

Activities can take the form of:

- projects (promotion and dissemination or market replication projects)
- or the establishment of new local and regional energy management agencies

Who can apply?

Any public or private organisation from the EU, Iceland, Norway, Liechtenstein and Croatia.

Projects must demonstrate clear European added value. Therefore, proposals must be submitted by consortia made up of at least three independent legal entities, each established in a different eligible country. The average consortia size for a project is 8-9 partners.

Funding available

The indicative total amount available for this call is about EUR 65m. Projects can be funded up to 75% of the total eligible costs.

The maximum duration of a project is three years.

Timetable

- Closing date for submission of your online application: **25th June 2009**, 17:00 CET
- Evaluation completed: December 2009
- Notification of applicants: starting in December 2009
- Contract negotiation: From December 2009 until March 2010 (see also contract negotiation for the 2008 call)
- Contract signature: starting in April 2010

Project length

The maximum duration of a project is three years.
