

## New FP7 Calls out now

The European Commission has recently launched new calls for proposals under the Framework Programme 7 for Research and Development.

53 new calls are out now covering 10 thematic areas under the Cooperation programme: *Health; Food, agriculture and fisheries, and biotechnology; Information and communication technologies; Nanosciences, nanotechnologies, materials and new production technologies; Energy; Environment (including climate change); Transport; Socio-economic sciences and humanities; Space; and Security.* For this call round a combined budget of over a £1bi is available for SMEs, large companies, research centres and universities.

The London Innovation Network helps Small and Medium Enterprises in London access grants opportunities and find partners in Europe to carry out their R&D projects. If you have an interesting project proposal, we can help you take it further.

# Open calls for proposals

## Health

An indicative budget of €333,5 million is available for health projects with emphasis on the development and validation of new therapies; promotion and prevention; child health; healthy ageing; diagnostic tools and medical technologies; and, sustainable and efficient healthcare systems.

- Single stage submission. Deadline 19 November 2009.
- Two-stage submission. First deadline 29 October 2009.

## Nanosciences, Nanotechnologies, Materials and new Production Technologies

The core objective of the NMP call will remain on generating high added value products and related processes and technologies to meet customer requirements as well as growth, public health, occupational safety, environmental protection, and societal values and expectations.

- For large-scale collaborative projects (FP7-NMP-2010-LARGE-4). Deadline 08 December 2009. Indicative budget €105mi.
- For small or medium-scale focused research projects (FP7-NMP-2010-SMALL-4). Deadline 08 December 2009. Indicative budget €50mi.
- For SME-targeted Collaborative Projects (FP7-NMP-2010-SME-4). Deadline, 08 December 2009. Indicative budget €20mi.
- Coordinated call EU-USA 2010 (FP7-NMP-2010-EU-USA) Deadline 30 November 2009. Indicative budget €6mi.
- Coordinated call EU-Mexico 2010 (FP7-NMP-2010-EU-Mexico). Deadline 15 December 2009. Indicative budget €6mi.
- For Coordination and Support Actions (FP7-NMP-2010-CSA-4). Deadline, 02 February 2010. Indicative Budget €6,5 million.

## Information and Communication Technologies (ICT)

- ICT CALL 5 (FP7-ICT-2009-5). Indicative budget: €732mi. Deadline: 26 October 2009.
- FET Open Scheme (FP7-ICT-2009-C). Deadline: 24th May 2011.

## Food, Agriculture and Fisheries and Biotechnology

It focuses on research for improving and optimising primary agricultural production systems; and, new approaches to fisheries management, animal welfare and mollusc diseases. It also emphasises on industrial, environmental and marine biotechnologies.

- General call for proposals (FP7-KBBE-2010-4), deadline 14 January 2010. Indicative budget of €190 mi.

## Energy

- Energy Call 1 (FP7-ENERGY-2010-1). Indicative budget €54mi. Deadline 15 October 2009.
- Energy Call 2 (FP7-ENERGY-2010-2). Indicative budget €126,4mi. Deadline 04 March 2010.

  - €9 million from Food, Agriculture and Fisheries, and Biotechnology (KBBE)

- FP7-INFLUENZA-2010, deadline 29 October 2009. Indicative budget of €18mi.

Within the framework of the European recovery plan, the NMP 2010 calls will focus on research and innovation in manufacturing, the construction industry and the automobile sector which will be implemented as Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs).

- PPP “Energy-efficient Buildings” (FP7-2010-NMP-ENV-ENERGY-ICT-EeB). Indicative budget €65mi (NMP, ICT, Energy and Environment). Deadline 03 November 2009
- PPP “Factories of the Future” (FP7-2010-NMP-ICT-FoF). Indicative budget €95mi (NMP and ICT). Deadline 03 November 2009.
- PPP “Green Cars” (FP7-2010-GC-ELECTROCHEMICAL-STORAGE). Indicative budget €25mi (NMP, Energy, Environment and Transport). Deadline 14 January 2010.

## New to FP7

This section outlines what FP7 is all about, focusing on the opportunities available for Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises (SMEs).

### What is FP7?

FP7 refers to 7th Framework Programme for Research, Technological Development and Demonstration Activities. It aims to bring companies together across Europe to foster economic development by encouraging and funding Research, Development and Innovation. It is the European Commission's main tool for R&D with an allocated budget of over €50bn between 2007 and 2013.

### SMEs and FP7

FPs have historically supported large-scale strategic projects. More recently, however, there has been a shift towards including more SMEs.

The European Commission is therefore keen to optimize the impact of the FP7 on SMEs. In practical terms it means that at least 15 per cent of the overall budget, or €7.5bn, is expected to be granted to SMEs.

### Benefits and challenges for SMEs

As the largest research programme in the world, FP7 offers the opportunity for SMEs to perform R&D that looks too far into the future to be carried out alone. That is to say that FP7 does not exist to help your organisation to survive nor to fund short term day-to-day projects. This is an important difference to highlight as the application process is long, complex and time-consuming.

Nevertheless, this very complexity can be seen as an opportunity. More than financial support for research, due to its strong transnational element, FP7 allows SMEs to strengthen their position in the market through building networks with international partners such as companies and research centres inside and outside Europe.

If you are thinking of applying for FP7 you can count on the [London Innovation Network](#) to help you assess whether it is the right funding for you and help you through the application process.

## What does it fund?

FP7 funds conceptual Research and Development projects. The most suitable project type for SMEs is collaborative projects which are “focused research projects with a clearly defined scientific and technological objectives and specific expected results”.

For SMEs, the reimbursement rate for collaborative projects is up to 75 per cent of the eligible R&D costs. For other activities (i.e. consortium management) it can be up to 100 per cent of eligible costs.

Typically, small or medium research projects can receive a contribution of €1-3m, whereas large scale integrating projects can access €6-12m\*.

\*NB. Figures are merely indicative and can vary from with each call. You should check that your proposal meets minimum eligibility criteria and maximum EC contribution thresholds as outlined in the specific call.

## Who, how and when to apply?

Collaborative projects are carried out by consortia made up of participants from different countries, Member States and Associated Countries. Eligible participants can be universities, research centres, multinational corporations, SMEs, public administrations and individuals. Organisations from International Cooperation Partner Countries are also eligible as long as the consortia meet the required minimum of Member States participants.

Eligible consortia requires as minimum condition the participation of least three legal entities, each of which is established in a Member State or Associated country, and no two of which are established in the same Member State or Associated country.

FP7 is implemented through calls for proposals launched quarterly. Each call covers specific areas of research and to be considered for application your project must fit in its criteria. More information (work programmes, call fiche, guides for applicants) is provided on the [Cordis](#) Website.
